ITI INITIATIVES



SCHOLARSHIPS

The Iowa Turfgrass Institute administers three college scholarship programs that annually identify and recognize oustanding students who plan careers in turfgrass management.

The A.E. Cott Memorial Scholarship, established to honor the life of former ISU extension horticulturist and the ITI's founder and first director, is awarded to one individual each year who is enrolled at ISU with an interest in pursuing a career in turfgrass.

The William E. Byers Memorial Scholarship, named after former Des Moines Golf and Country Club's 50-year Superintendent and charter member of the ITI, is awarded annually to a deserving Iowa college student working toward a degree in turfgrass management.

The ITI Scholarship Program provides financial assistance to numerous collegiate students each year who are enrolled in turfgrass management.

Scholarships have been awarded to students at the following schools: Iowa State, Kirkwood, Indian Hills, Hawkeye, Iowa Lakes, Iowa Western, Iowa Central, and Upper Iowa.



RESEARCH

The Iowa Turfgrass Institute continues to support turfgrass research projects, its fundamental core purpose of existance.

In 2017, the ITI granted \$19,000 to Iowa State University reseach projects spearheaded by Dr. Adam Thoms and Dr. Nick Christians. Research projects conducted in 2017 include: golf course putting green organic matter management, rough bluegrass control, bermudagrass cultivar testing, improving athletic field safety and performance of natural grass athletic fields, and a high traffic area study.

In 2015/2016, the ITI joined forces with the Iowa Golf Course Superintendents Association, the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America, and the Iowa Golf Association, by providing \$30,000 in funding to support a comprehensive Water Quality Study for Iowa golf courses. Study results indicated that golf courses in lowa are not a major source of nutrients for groundwater and surface water resources. Results from the study indicate groundwater nutrient concentrations beneath golf course facilities are typically well below levels of concern.



Message from Iowa State University Assistant Professor

The support of the Iowa Turfgrass Institute has been critical to continue turfgrass research at Iowa State University. As many of you know, the State of Iowa has been dealing with a very tight budget the last couple of years and that outlook is expected to continue for a few more years. The support of the turfgrass industry in Iowa helps keep a turfgrass position at Iowa State University. Other surrounding states have not had that support and turfgrass programs have been cut, or will be eliminated as positions open. The University expects an externally funded research and Extension program; simply put, this means no state dollars are used to support research. Much of the national turfgrass industry dollars for research have been eliminated with the mergers of many of the turfgrass chemical and fertilizer companies, putting even more importance on a strong state industry. In the near future Dr. Christians' plans to retire and having statewide industry support will hopefully help Iowa State decide to refill his position as a turfgrass position and not have it be refilled as something else.

Funds given for research help pay for supplies used in projects, mileage and vehicle rental to visit test sites, partial funding for graduate students, funding for undergraduate student labor, and equipment purchases for specific research projects. My goal has always been to present the results of the funded studies each year for the turfgrass industry to see. As a new faculty member, I have relied on this funding to help establish a program and develop projects that are beneficial to all of the Iowa Turfgrass industry. I hope that you consider helping push the turfgrass industry ahead in Iowa by becoming an ITI Partner.


